- In Nigeria, the number of COVID-19 cases continues to rise, and the unprecedented impact has shown the vulnerability of our health system
- Nigeria already has a critical shortage of health professionals and sadly many health workers who are our first line of defense serving on the front lines of the COVID-19 fight have been affected by the virus
- We must protect and support our health workers to safely and effectively do their jobs

This requires a nationwide workforce of trusted, confident, expert health professionals who can stop the next health threat wherever and whenever it comes - and protect themselves in the process



# Investing in our Human Capacity





Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) is a multi-disciplinary approach to identifying and stopping the spread of infectious diseases but Nigeria's health care system has a critical IPC gap



We need to fill this gap by building and sustaining the capacity of our health workers to rapidly and safely respond to outbreaks



Thus, DRASA plans to establish Nigeria's first-ever IPC Simulation Training Center to train 10,000+ health professionals each year who will be prepared, equipped, and ready to protect our public health






PHASE 3 : Expand to other industries


